







ANNUAL PERFORMANCE OF DISTRICT JUDICIARY (SEP 2018 – AUG 2019)

Pendency at the end of Month excluding NMDs- Month Wise in 2019





Judicial Case Load Vs Performance - 2019 in District Judiciary of Khyber Pakhtunkhuwa excluding NMDs




Transfers of Judicial Officers and Court Staff to NMDs in the month of February 2019 affected the performance.

Total Pendency Recorded in the End of August 2019 is **5506**




Performance Analysis of 1st Performance Year

1st Performance Year Target

- Target set for 1st Performance year was 25% reduce in the Pendency in the District Judiciary.
- However 7% of the Target achieved in the District Judiciary.

Initiatives Taken to Achieve The Target

- Consultations in term of Workshops, Meetings and Online Video Conferences with the District Judiciary.
- Notifications in term of 6% or above disposals over the Institutions for the district Judiciary.
- Requested Provincial Government for creation of seats.
- Requested Public Service Commission for recruitment of Civil Judges.
- Under CMR, initially notification for 100 Cases Notifications
- Through constant monitoring and planning later on 08 Disposals per court per month under Case Management Rules.
 - Regional Training were imparted to members of the BAR and Bench on CMR.
 - Creation of Data Analysis Wing (DAW) for assisting in decision and policy makings.
- On the basis of feedback, time to time Unit Policy Scheme was reviewed for better implementation of the scheme.
- Human Resource deficiency was overcome by filling the vacant post of ministerial staff in Transparent Manner.




Performance Analysis of 1st Performance Year

from September-18 to August-19(Excluding NMDs)




Factors for not achieving the Targets


- Shortage of 40 AD&SJ and Failure on the part of ;Provincial Govt to sanctioned the vacancies despite of approved summary.
- Shortage of 87 CJs which could not be recommended by the provincial Public Service Commission, which have now been advertised for Exam on October 28. 2019.
- Transfer of Judicial Officers from Settled Districts to NMDs.
- Transfer and Posting of Judicial Officers within Settled Districts in case of need.
- Transfer of 03 AD&SJ to Child Protection Courts from the regular courts as Provincial Government did not approve the 34 positions for the child protection courts.
